## **Living Out Our Faith**

In Luke's gospel we find the familiar words from Jesus, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed." (Luke 4:18)

As churches we desire to follow the steps of Jesus and proclaim good news to captives.

However, often our orthopraxy and orthodoxy hold gaps, what we say and believe doesn't always translate into practiced discipleship.

Prison Fellowship Scotland (PFS) are in a unique position in Scotland: valued and respected by SPS; they enable churches to engage safely and appropriately with people volunteer within groups in prison and live out an orthopraxy of those verses in Luke.

PFS give the church an opportunity to be good news to those of our neighbours behind bars held in prisons across Scotland.

I am a church leader as well as a Chaplain in business and for me that's how I got involved with PFS. My desire was not just to preach Luke 4:18, but also live it out. And there are many ways PFS can help

When prayer and strategy come together, good things can happen. With Scottish Government plans for Restorative Justice services to be

widely available across Scotland by 2023, at PFS we are keen for more opportunities to run our Sycamore Tree course in prisons in Scotland - and are especially looking at places where we have historically had

less opportunity.

At the same time as we were exploring these opportunities, PFS volunteers, Greg and Sonja who live in Dumfries had been praying for their local prison.

"God placed the burden for HMP Dumfries on our hearts over 3 years ago. We knew from the very beginning that it would take time, but God gave us the persistence and the patience to wait.

Sometimes the waiting was quietly in prayer, sometimes it was pushing doors and making contacts and connections; sometimes

to meet the Governor who we were excited to find was keen for the Sycamore Tree course to be run in the prison.

It was exciting to see

God's hand in this work and how doors opened for us.

As we write this, we have iust completed week three of the Sycamore Tree course; it's humbling to talk with the men doing the course and see them respond

to a message of hope and restoration that is brought through this course."

and Lilias community care units


Jesus, you love

## **Mental Health in Prison**

Over the summer of 2022 I had the privilege of working with Deirdre Yellowlees, Chaplain at HMP Perth.

Together we facilitated an 8-week mental health education and awareness course known as the **Sanctuary Course**, which enabled a small number of prisoners to engage in important conversations about mental health and mental illness.

My own interest in mental health came about because of the sudden loss of my son in 2016. From almost no knowledge about mental health whatsoever, within 18 months I was admitted to the Royal Edinburgh Hospital, the city's main psychiatric facility. Medical staff responsible for my care progressed a "compulsory treatment order" (I was sectioned) and I was kept in hospital for 9 weeks.

The experience of confronting my own mental health

breakdown, and the importance of God's love and grace in my recovery, led me to two faith-based organisations, 'The Mind and Soul Foundation' and 'Sanctuary UK'.

Three years after leaving hospital I was driving past HMP Perth and had a strong sense that within those walls were men that I could now relate to in a way that previously would simply not have been possible. I applied to become a Prison Fellowship volunteer and was thrilled when I was invited to become part of the volunteer team in Perth.

The course, which has a similar video/discussion format to the Alpha course, is designed for church use in the first instance, however we found that with good preparation this was not an issue at all.

As a facilitator I found that the key challenges included:

 accepting the need to be flexible.

- choosing the right questions from the course content.
- listening rather than over-contributing myself.
- bringing the conversation back to the course content when it started to drift into unhelpful aspects of prison life.

We are immensely grateful to Sanctuary Mental Health Ministries for the quality and focus of the course. With faith and hope right at the centre of the course material, the Sanctuary Course is a highly relevant Prison Fellowship resource.




